

About Anamudi Shola National Park:

- Anamudi Shola National Park is in the **Idukki district** of Kerala, India, within the **Western Ghats**.
- The draft notification for the establishment of Anamudi Shola National Park was released on 21 November 2003, highlighting its relatively recent status as a protected area.
- The park encompasses three sholas: Mannavan shola, Idivara shola, and Pullardi shola.
- The park is managed by the Munnar Wildlife Division and is part of a protected area network that includes Mathikettan Shola National Park, Eravikulam National Park, Pampadum Shola National Park, Chinnar Wildlife Sanctuary, and the Kurinjimala Sanctuary.
- This Western Ghats region, specifically the Anamalai sub-cluster encompassing Eravikulam National Park, is being considered by the UNESCO World Heritage Committee for potential inclusion as a World Heritage Site.
- Notable wildlife species found here include the Elephant, Tiger, Nilgiri tahr, Gaur, Spotted Deer,
 Sambar, Grizzled Giant Squirrel, Hanuman Langur, Sloth Bear, and Flying Squirrels.
