

U Tirot Sing Syiem

The **Meghalaya** government recently unveiled a life-size bust of Khasi freedom fighter U Tirot Sing Syiem at **the Indira Gandhi Cultural Centre** (IGCC) in Dhaka, Bangladesh.

• This event honors the sacrifice and valor of **U Tirot Sing Syiem**, commemorating his pivotal role in the struggle against British colonialism.

About the U Tirot Sing Syiem:

- U Tirot Sing Syiem was a **Khasi chief** in the early **19th** century, who had led the resistance against **British** attempts to control the Khasi Hills.
- Known for his courage and leadership, he spearheaded the Khasi soldiers in their battle against British oppression.

Contribution in Anglo-Khasi War:

- On April 4, 1829, U Tirot Sing Syiem initiated an attack on the British Garrison at Nongkhlaw, signaling the beginning of a significant conflict.
- This action led to a **4-year-long struggle** between the **Khasi soldiers**, under U Tirot Sing Syiem's leadership, and the **British forces**.
- Despite facing challenges such as **lack of firearms**, the **Khasi fighters** engaged in **guerrilla** warfare tactics against the **British**.
- Tirot Sing's **resistance** was marked by his **determination** to protect his people and land from foreign intrusion.
- In January 1833, U Tirot Sing Syiem was captured by the British and deported to Dhaka, where he faced martyrdom on 17 July 1835.
- His death is commemorated in Meghalaya as U Tirot Sing Day.
